2nd GRACE Training Workshop



The Department of Clinical Microbiology at Christian Medical College (CMC), Vellore, organised the 2nd GRACE Training Workshop (General Rural and Community Laboratories Establishment) from 26th to 31st May, 2025. This initiative aimed to identify challenges, train personnel, and enhance diagnostic capabilities in rural laboratories within the CMC mission network hospitals.

The workshop focused on strengthening early detection of infectious diseases in peripheral rural hospitals. Following a thorough needs assessment, 15 participants registered for the course from 14 mission hospitals across 9 states, week-long hands-on training programme conducted by the Department of Clinical Microbiology.

The event commenced with an inaugural prayer by Chaplain Rev. Pearson, followed by an overview of the programme by the Course Coordinator, Dr. Beula Subashini. Dr. Balaji, Professor of Clinical Microbiology, warmly welcomed the participants.

Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director and Associate Director (Missions), emphasised the critical role of diagnostic laboratories in ensuring timely and effective healthcare in underserved regions. He acknowledged the dedication of mission hospital staff who continue to work with limited resources and often in challenging environments, underscoring how capacity-building initiatives like the GRACE Workshop serve as vital investments in both health infrastructure and human resource development.

Dr. Sebin, Missions Coordinator, also addressed the gathering and highlighted the broader vision of the missions department in supporting sustainable health systems. His remarks reinforced the workshop's focus on practical skill-building aligned with long-term community impact.

The workshop covered a wide range of topics, from basic to advanced laboratory techniques, tailored to address the specific diagnostic challenges identified in the network hospitals. Participants engaged in both lectures and practical sessions designed to enhance their skills and knowledge.

The programme concluded with a valedictory function, where participants were awarded certificates by Dr. John Jude, Head, Microbiology, for their successful completion of the training. This initiative was made possible through support from the CMC Vellore Mission Network Grant 2023 and the Australian Alumni Grant 2023, provided by the Australian Consulate General, Chennai.

At the conclusion of this third workshop the programme has successfully trained 37 participants in 32 mission hospitals across 23 states. The initiative was highly appreciated by participants, who expressed deep gratitude for the opportunity to enhance their skills and contribute more effectively to their laboratories and local communities.

World Day for Safety and Health at Work 2025









In commemoration of the World Day for Safety and Health at Work, the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus organised a series of awareness programmes and training sessions for all health professionals from 28th April to 30th April, 2025. The events aimed to promote a culture of safety and health in the workplace and to equip staff with practical knowledge on occupational safety.

Day 1: April 28, 2025

An awareness talk on Healing the Healers was delivered by Dr. Kanagalakshmi, Professor of Community Medicine and Health and Safety Officer, Town Campus. She emphasised the importance of preventing various workplace hazards - physical, chemical, psychosocial, radiation-related, and ergonomic using relevant case examples.

Dr. Kanagalakshmi also reoriented healthcare professionals on the critical role of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in hazard prevention and elaborated on institutional policies related to needle-stick injuries.

The session began with a warm welcome by Mrs. JP Grace Angeline, Associate Professor. The weekly schedules and activities were communicated to the group. The vote of thanks was delivered by Mrs. Nirmala Margaret P., Principal, CON, CMCVCC.

Day 2 & 3: April 29 - 30, 2025

A series of hands-on and interactive training sessions were conducted for the security personnel, RedSky staff, and Fire and Safety personnel at Chittoor Campus on the theme Move Smart: The Key to Patient Care and Staff Well-being. Mr. Dharani Kumar V. and Mr. Joshua C., Occupational Therapists from CMCVCC, demonstrated the correct body mechanics for transferring patients between a stretcher and a cot, emphasising techniques to minimise physical strain and injury risk.

Mr. Allen Joseph, Physiotherapist at CMCVCC, conducted a practical session on basic warm-up exercises, which the participants joined with great enthusiasm.

Additionally, a session focused on the safe handling of chemicals was led by Ms. Mary, HICC Nurse, for RedSky staff. She enlightened them on safe chemical handling practices, spillage management, and appropriate PPE usage.

Ms. Namitha, Tutor from the Medical Nursing Department, provided training to the RedSky staff on first aid management of chemical splashes. Various chemicals used in the clinical area were displayed, and the aspects of prevention and protection were explained to raise awareness.

On April 30, a brief introductory talk was given by Dr. Reginald Alex, Deputy MS, Chittoor Campus, and Occupational Safety Officer. The final session, titled Safe Moves, Better Care: Body Mechanics for Health Professionals, was conducted for all healthcare workers by Mr. Ronald Thombic Maradona, Tutor, Occupational Therapy, Occupational Health Team, Town Campus. He discussed common causes of muscle strain in healthcare settings and provided practical tips for safe movements and proper posture. The session concluded with group warm-up exercises, which were actively performed by all attendees.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Mrs. J. P. Grace Angeline, Associate Professor, CON, CMCVCC.

Fifth Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) ® Provider Course



The Department of Trauma Surgery recently conducted the fifth Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS)® Provider Course from May 29 to 31, 2025, at the Paul Brand Building, CMC Vellore.

Sixteen doctors from various departments and institutions participated enthusiastically under the guidance of Dr. Winston Noronha, Professor in the Department of General Surgery at Meenakshi Dental College, Chennai, who served as the Course Director. This marks another step in the department's ongoing efforts to improve trauma care, education, and injury prevention nationwide

The course structure emphasizes critical thinking, collaboration, and a team-based approach to trauma care. It is designed to be highly interactive, with training led by certified doctors and hands-on practice using manikins and simulated patients. This approach ensures active participation and provides a deeper understanding of the material.

These initiatives reflect the department's unwavering commitment to educational excellence, strengthening trauma care capabilities, and fostering a culture of continuous learning and improvement.

Workshop on Multilevel Modelling and Generalised Estimating Equations



The Clinical Epidemiology Unit (CEU) organised a two-day workshop on Multilevel Modelling and Generalised Estimating Equations on May 30 and 31, 2025, at the New Examination Hall, Bagayam Campus, CMC Vellore.

The faculty consisted of Prof. L. Jeyaseelan, Adjunct Professor, CEU and Professor, Biostatistics, Mohammad bin Rashid University, Dubai; Ms. Jothilakshmi, Statistician, Schizophrenia Research Foundation (SCARF, India); and Mr. Srinivas, Biostatistician. Obituaries



Dr. Ramabai Ponnudurai (nee Devadasan) (MBBS batch of 1946), passed away on 7th May, 2025.

Dr. Ramabai Ponnudurai (nee Devadasan) was born in Palayankottai, Tamil Nadu on August 19, 1927. She was the third of six daughters, and their father, a renowned attorney named all of them after famous women. All sisters were well-educated and married to equally educated men who sought their hand in marriage despite Mr. Devadasan refusing to give dowry for any of them, not wishing to diminish the standing of his successful daughters.

She lived a full and vibrant life and passed away in the same town where she was born and raised, on May 7, 2025 at the age of 97. She belonged to the CMC batch of 1946, the last batch of only women admitted to the college. She exemplified the motto "To serve, and not to be served", by dedicating her life to the service of others. She was a phenomenal woman in every way, as a daughter, a wife, a mother, a grandmother and a great-grandmother, and most importantly a wonderful physician.

Following her graduation, she worked in government service and served in numerous small towns. She married Prof. E. D. Ponnudurai in May 1956, and they had two daughters. While Prof. Ponnudurai went on a scholarship to the United States for graduate studies at Columbia University, she stayed behind with their older daughter, since she felt that her skills would be best utilized serving the poor in India. During that time, while she was on duty performing autopsies at the local hospital, there was a large mob gathered outside demanding that the death of a prominent local politician be ruled a suicide. She was unfazed by the demands, determined the death to be the result of homicidal strangulation, and asked another senior physician from the nearby town to come in the middle of the night to ascertain and certify the correct cause of death. This is just one instance of her courage and extraordinary strength that she demonstrated throughout her life, always unafraid to do the right thing.

She was principled, yet charitable and kind to the many people she served, delivering numerous babies and being the family physician for generations of families in Palayankottai where she set up a private practice after leaving the government service. She gave financial help to many who reached out to her, as well as emotional support in addition to healing for her many patients. She was incredibly generous of her time and all her resources, never questioning or doubting who sought her help. While there were many who would tell a heart-wrenching story as to why they needed assistance, no one was turned away empty-handed. Once, there was a young woman who came back years later to thank her, saying that she had helped pay her examination fees at a time when she had no one to turn to, and that had ensured her getting gainful employment and becoming self-sufficient. That willingness to always lend a helping hand to anyone who sought her out was a testament to a life deeply rooted in the Christian faith of service.

She was fiercely loyal, devoted to her family, and to her many friends. She enjoyed interacting with people of all ages, mentoring the young, and being a source of inspiration to many who followed her in her profession. She retired at age 80, but her door was always open to anyone who wanted to stop by for advice or a friendly chat. Her warmth, her affection and her wonderful laugh were infectious, and invited a steady stream of visitors who dropped by until the very end.

She was multitalented, a gifted artist who could paint, draw, sew, knit and do any number of artistic pursuits. She was an expert cook and passed down many of her wonderful recipes to family and friends. She was an elegant host, who entertained many from all over India and the world, while her husband served as the Principal of St. John's College. Her love of gardening made everything thrive around her – she brought cuttings and saplings from her travel to other places and tended to them carefully so that the home was surrounded by greenery with frequent blooms. She lavished her care and love on her family, and was hospitable to all those who needed her support. She was unbeatable in the game of scrabble, chinese checkers and other board and word games. She was a voracious reader, and taught her children and grandchildren to enjoy books by reading to them regularly.

Her dedication to her profession was exceptional, and it was a clear calling for her. Her patients adored her, and generations spoke about how she cared for them. She was known as one of the best doctors in the district, serving people from all faiths and backgrounds, and many traveling several miles to get her professional help.

Her passing was an immense loss to her family, her older daughter Kanchana Jeyathilagar, son-in-law Jeyathilagar, younger daughter Kalpana Nathan (MBBS batch of 1979-80), grandchildren, Minothi, Minthami, Jeyakesh and their spouses, granddaughter Nila and greatgrandchildren.

Her funeral service was held at 4 pm on May 9, at Christ Church, Palyankottai, and the prayer meeting was held at St. Johns College Chapel on May 10, 2025.
