Their sessions covered key developments in diagnostic tools, interdisciplinary approaches, and recent advances in medical dermatology, fostering a holistic management of dermatological conditions.

In partnership with the Missions Office, a Zoom link was shared with mission hospitals to facilitate participation by doctors in peripheral settings who have an interest in dermatology. This initiative extended the symposium's reach and impact, supporting continued learning and engagement among healthcare providers serving in remote areas.

The second day was dedicated to *postgraduate training*, featuring hands-on and interactive sessions, including OSCEs, spotters, histopathology slide reviews, and splint application demonstrations, and viva-style discussions. The programme was well-received and saw participation from over 100 postgraduate trainees across the country.

The symposium served as an enriching platform for knowledge sharing and interdisciplinary collaboration, benefiting both trainees and practicing dermatologists.



CORPORA 2025- A educational endeavor for school students in Vellore

The Department of Anatomy, CMC Vellore, opened its doors to higher secondary school students from various schools in Vellore for a teaching programme called “CORPORA” from 18th to 22nd August, 2025. The programme was inaugurated on 18th August, with Mr. Chandrasekaran from the Udhavam Ullangal NGO gracing the occasion as the chief guest. He delivered an inspiring talk to the students present, emphasising how each one of them has the potential to make a difference in the world. The programme has been conducted intermittently since 2004, born from the realisation of how much of Human Biology is covered in the current school curriculum and the immense potential for making these topics exciting for school students. It was a unique opportunity for school students and teachers to see the parts of the Human Body and to learn about important aspects related to health.

Close to 4000 school children and about 200 teachers from 46 schools in and around Vellore were able to participate. A carefully curated collection of over 100 preserved specimens, plastinates, luminal casts, bones and models were displayed with appropriate labels and explanatory write-ups in Tamil and English, tailored specifically to the higher secondary school Biology curriculum. Anatomy staff were available on site to clarify doubts and provide explanations.

A team of dedicated nurses from the College of Nursing, Community Nursing Department delivered health education for students on a variety of topics related to healthy lifestyle, road safety, hazards of smoking, personal hygiene etc. Mr. Jayasankar, transplant coordinator from the office of the Medical Superintendent, introduced students to organ and body donation.

Second-Opinion Connect Initiative launched from CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus

The Distance Education Unit, in collaboration with the Missions Department, has launched a Provider-to-Provider (Doctor-to-Doctor) Teleconsultation programme called 'Second-Opinion Connect', which will be linked to the Missions Portal, CMCVCONNECT. To begin with, five consultants from the CMC Vellore, Chittoor campus, will offer their services to our mission hospital network on specified days and times each week in the specialities of Medicine, Psychiatry, Neurology/Neurosurgery, ENT, and Urology. The schedule has been communicated to mission hospitals, and the doctors there must complete an electronic request form every time they wish to utilise this facility. Once this is pilot-tested, it will be expanded by adding other specialities as well.

The virtual inauguration of this initiative took place on August 11, 2025, via Zoom. This meeting, which also included a demonstration of the CMCVCONNECT portal and the Second-Opinion Connect module, was attended by representatives from various CMC and mission hospitals. Dr. Adeline Sither, in charge of the Distance Education Unit, welcomed the participants. An introduction to the initiative was given by the Medical Superintendent, Dr. Rajesh I, and the Associate Director (Missions), Dr. Jachin Velavan. At the same time, Mr. Divya Kumar, IT lead of the Distance Education Unit, walked everyone through the process flow.

The Director, Dr. Vikram Mathews, in his felicitation speech, emphasised the importance of this facility being available for remotely based mission hospitals as well as the need to integrate many aspects, such as learning resources, mission research dashboard, etc., into the CMCVCONNECT so that it can be a one-stop portal for all mission needs. Felicitations were also extended by Dr. Uday Zachariah, Associate Director (Chittoor campus), Dr. Sedevi Angami, Director, CIHSR, Dimapur, on behalf of Mission Hospitals, and Dr. Rajshekhar V, on behalf of the Hub Specialists. The Head of Chaplaincy offered the inaugural prayer, and Rev. Finney Alexander proposed the vote of thanks, which Mr. Nidhi Koshy, the administrative head of the Distance Education Unit, seconded.

This type of teleconsultation can lead to faster diagnoses, improved disease management, and increased patient satisfaction, particularly in rural areas. This Hub-and-Spoke Model helps overcome geographical barriers and provides access to specialised care in areas where it may be limited or unavailable. The first Second-Opinion Connect Consultation was held on August 19th. We hope that more mission hospitals will avail themselves of this facility to support them in their patient care.

Distance Education Unit runs Self-Learning Module (SLM) Writing Workshop in CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus

Globally, education has moved out of the traditional classroom, and Blended Learning and Flipped Classrooms have become efficient and popular. Self-learning modules have formed the centrepiece of all blended learning courses run by the Distance Education Unit since 2004. Some departments are already running Blended Learning courses in collaboration with the Distance Education Unit, and several others are aspiring to start one. The skill of writing self-learning modules is helpful for any department seeking to launch a course on a blended learning or online platform. The Distance Education Unit conducted a one-day workshop on writing Self-Learning Modules (SLMs) at the College of Nursing at CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus on 22nd July, 2025.



This workshop, open to all CMC staff, attracted a total of 27 participants from various departments, including Anatomy, Biochemistry, Radiodiagnosis, PICU, the Chittoor Medical faculty, the Nursing Faculty from the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore Chittoor campus, and Distance Education. The topics included Adult Learning principles, Assessments for Adult Learners, with a close look at concepts such as developing a roadmap for a module, learning how to write and develop SLM content, and the use of pictures and graphics in a module. There were also sessions on Instructional design of Blended learning and a demo on Online SLM module development.

The hope is that this will facilitate many departments of CMC to contribute significantly to the considerable training needs outside the institution, leveraging the abundant expertise existing within these departments, toward wider health transformation in the nation.



Clinical Epidemiology Unit Organises Institutional Epidemiology Workshop (E2- Protocol Development) For MD / MS Post Graduate Registrars

The Clinical Epidemiology Unit, CEU, organised the Institutional Epidemiology Workshop - protocol development for the first year MD / MS / MOT post-graduates at the New Examination Hall between 26th and 28th August 2025 (Batch II) on behalf of the principal's office. The workshop was attended by 83 MD / MS/MOT postgraduate registrars from all specialities. The workshop started with a word of prayer by Chaplain Ms.Saramma Kuruvilla, a welcome address by Dr. Vignesh Kumar, Coordinator CEU, and an inspiring talk on "Why do research?" by Dr. Sathya Subramani, Professor and Head, Department of Physiology. The topics covered were research question, study designs, research ethics, sample size calculation, data analysis, CRF creation and practical sessions on literature search, data dictionary, Zotero software, Epidata software, PSPP software and protocol development. The registrars had a group discussion session discussing their research topics and study designs with the faculty. The faculty consisted of Dr. J.P. The Short course on Chemotherapy

The departments of Haematology, Haemato-oncology & Medical Surgical Nursing speciality XI (Haematology Nursing), along with the Continuing Professional Advancement & Blended Learning Cell, inaugurated their 7th batch of the short course in Chemotherapy for nurses between August 25th and September 21st, 2025.

This is a 4-week, onsite programme, with participants being posted in the concerned clinical area of CMC, Vellore. A total of 4 trainees are to undergo the programme, with 2 trainees each, from the CSI hospital in Trichy and from CMC Vellore. A brief overview of the course was offered by Ms. Latha Gracelin, the course coordinator. The Dean, College of Nursing, Professor Shandril Gnanatheebam, Deputy Nursing superintendent, Professor Shanthi Gladston, Dr. Aby Abraham, Professor & Head of Haematology, felicitated the gathering. The programme ended with a vote of thanks proposed by Professor Jeyalindha Christopher, Lead faculty, The Continuing Professional Advancement & Blended Learning Cell.

Faculty from the Departments of Haematology, Haemato-oncology Nursing, along with the Continuing Professional Advancement & Blended Learning Cell, facilitate the sessions and the logistics. This short course is designed to prepare registered nurses with specialised knowledge, skills, and competence in providing Chemotherapy to patients battling cancer. It also aims to equip them to educate, train, and counsel patients and caregivers on various aspects of Chemotherapy.



Short course on Peritoneal Dialysis

The departments of Nephrology & Medical Surgical Nursing, Speciality -IX (Nephrology Nursing), along with the Continuing Professional Advancement & Blended Learning Cell, conducted their 7th batch of the short course in Peritoneal Dialysis for nurses, between the 5th and the 29th of August, 2025. This was held as a 4-week onsite training in the peritoneal dialysis unit of CMC, Vellore. A nurse from the island country of Tanzania was trained, along with two nephrologists from the Muhimbili National Hospital, to establish a Peritoneal dialysis unit, perhaps the first one in their country. Faculty from the Departments of Nephrology & Nephrology Nursing, along with the Continuing Professional Advancement & Blended Learning Cell, facilitated the sessions and the logistics

The course is endorsed by the International Society of Nephrology (ISN), the Peritoneal Dialysis Society of India (PDSI), and the Indian Society of Nephrology. This short course is designed to prepare registered nurses working in nephrology settings with specialised knowledge, skills, and competence in providing Peritoneal Dialysis (PD) to patients with End Stage Renal Disease. It also aims to equip them to educate, train, and counsel patients and caregivers on various aspects of Peritoneal Dialysis. The nurses, through training, can take up autonomous roles as educators, facilitators, and counsellors, thus functioning as integral members of the Peritoneal Dialysis team. The delegate and her team expressed a high degree of satisfaction while giving their feedback on the course.



ICS National Talent Search - 2025

The Department of Pulmonary Medicine, Christian Medical College Vellore, Ranipet Campus, hosted the Indian Chest Society (ICS) National Talent Search 2025 on 22nd and 23rd August 2025. This prestigious academic event brought together postgraduate trainees in Pulmonology from across the southern states to showcase their clinical knowledge through interesting case and image presentations.

The two-day programme began with an inauguration on 22nd August, in the presence of dignitaries including Dr. Balamugesh T. (Associate Medical Superintendent), Dr. Succena Alexander (Vice Principal), Dr. Uday Zachariah (Associate Director) and Rev. Ebenezer. The welcome address was delivered by Dr. D.J. Christopher, followed by an overview of the program schedule by Dr. J.V.S. Aswith Chowdary. The inauguration began with the lighting of the lamp, with an exhortation to be the light of the World.

Interactive case discussions involved presentation of rare and challenging cases in an interactive format with Slido. The radiology image contest tested the interpretation skills and the ability to showcase the unusual. There was a Research Methodology Workshop, with sessions devoted to helping the delegates frame research questions, choosing appropriate study designs, interpreting diagnostic accuracy, and conducting a systematic literature search. This was conducted by Dr. J.V.S. Aswith Chowdary, Dr. Vignesh Kumar, Dr. Barney Isaac and Dr. Jefferson Daniel.

Obituaries

Dr. Maisy Oommen (nee Maisy Mathan) (MBBS batch of 1949), renowned pathologist, partner at Oommen's Eye Hospital, and founder of Sara Memorial Blood Bank, the first private blood bank in North Malabar, passed away on 27th August, 2025. She was born on 26 May 1931 and joined her MBBS course at CMC Vellore in 1949 and graduated in 1955. A native of Tiruvalla, Dr. Maisy resigned from her job in the Health Department to start Oommen's Eye Hospital and Sarah Memorial Medical Lab in Kannur with her husband, Dr. C.E. Oommen. In 1987, the medical lab was converted into Sarah Memorial Blood Bank. It was the first private blood bank in North Malabar. At that time, even government hospital did not have active blood banks. In 2002, a unit for separating blood components was also started here, which led to significant achievements in the medical field.



A former state president of the Indian Medical Association (IMA), she was always ready to serve outside the medical field as well. Serving as the President of the State Women's Football Association from 1977 to 1985, Dr. Maisy Oommen dedicated time to nurturing female football players and providing them with training. She served as the State President of the IMA from 1982 to 1983. She was the founder of the Rotary Inner Wheel School for mentally challenged children in 1987 and the YWCA hostel for women in 2002. From 2008 to 2013, she was a member of the Cantonment Board, State President of the Indian Medical Association, Cantonment Board Member and State President of the Women's Football Association. She was married to the late Dr. C.E. Oommen (Ophthalmologist). She is survived by her children, Dr. Raj Isaac Oommen (Ophthalmic Surgeon, Oommen's Eye Hospital), Mr. Moti Oommen (Cannanore Drug House), daughters-in-law Dr. Mary Oommen (Oommen's Eye Hospital) and Mrs. Asha Oommen, grandchildren Ashish, Ashok, Nimmi and Naomi.
